HEALTH INSURANCE POLICY

One of Tec de Monterrey's main concerns is the health and safety of all our community; therefore, it is **MANDATORY** for all international students to be covered by an international health insurance plan that complies with at least the following coverage:

Note: Students participating in our **Virtual Exchange Program (VEP)** from abroad, won't need to show proof of insurance coverage.

After admission and prior to their arrival in Mexico, students MUST provide proof of coverage that includes the above minimums. Failure to do so will result in an automatic charge of Tec de Monterrey's institutional insurance (SURA TRAVEL INSURANCE).

VISA

The visa required to study in Mexico is defined by the nationality of the student.

- Non-restricted nationalities: Require an FMM (migratory form obtained upon entry to the country), and do not need a student visa if the stay is for 180 days or less (semester or summer terms).
- Restricted nationalities: Require a visa that must be issued at any Mexican consulate or embassy, regardless of the time of stay. To review the list of restricted nationalities, visit: https://bit.ly/INMrequiredvisa



Everyone coming to Mexico for more than 180 days (a year or more), is required to have a student visa.

The service is valid from the beginning of the semester until the last day of classes. If the students apply for two semesters, they will have hire it again, on the second semester. This insurance includes the repatriation of mortal remains and the requirements of the Argentine state.

Project Management

4 credits - 2023-I and 2023-II

The course allows students to learn the fundamentals of Project Management and its application in a company. The main goal is to introduce students to the fundamental concepts of Project Management, the different areas of knowledge of the PMBOK® following the structure of the guide and how they are applied to a project. Likewise, we will analyze project management in Agile and SCRUM.

Innovation Management

4 credits - 2023-I and 2023-II

With this course, the student manages to explore and apply the entire innovation process in the company (Business Innovation), from the birth of an idea - as a solution to a problem - to its implementation within the business model - through a new product or service. Agile methodologies are also explored for the generation, validation and implementation of ideas, concepts and projects; which are essential to solve complex problems in constantly changing environments.

Social Media Marketing

4 credits - 2023-II

This course is for students who are interested in performing the functions of a Community Manager as a job or for a personal entrepreneur project. It consists of a simulation game where groups will be posting content for a specific company and its products in Social Media Platforms to connect with specific segment groups in the hopes of creating a relationship and selling more.

COURSES TAUGHT IN ENGLISH – BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

CAMPUS LIMA

Corporate Social Responsibility

4 credits - 2023-I and 2023-II

The course presents current trends in sustainable business development, both nationally and internationally. It considers the conceptual, anthropological and social foundations that give rise to this form of behavior, the previous processes, and the implementation and monitoring of a corporate social responsibility system. The role of business will be analyzed beyond the creation of economic value and the student will be prepared for the consideration of ethical criteria in making business decisions. considering the common good, social development of those involved, environmental protection and cultural promotion.

Management of Employability

4 credits - 2023-II

The course aims to expose the student to several realities that he/she will find in the transition from student life to internships, to first permanent jobs and/or the steps to form his own business/company. The course will deal with concrete and practical issues to enter the labor market (evaluation of companies, CVs. interviews, networking, etc.) as well as theoretical macroeconomic/political or technological aspects that impact the concept of employment itself and may affect the present or future employability of a particular person. The class will receive people from the "real world" to prepare students and allow them the opportunity to ask directly and safely about this very important transition of life.

Foreign Trade

4 credits - 2023-I and 2023-II

This course aims to provide students with the tools and basic knowledge of international trade, and also get them to understand the benefits and opportunities that have been generated around trade and economic integration.

Creativity and Publicity

4 credits - 2023-1

Being a personalize counseling course, the subject has a personalized approach which allows the learner to discover the content on his own. Therefore, it is adapted to the current needs, according to the conversations between the student and the faculty member.

VISA INFORMATION

International students coming to UDLAP must take into account the following information according to their nationality and duration of their studies in Mexico.

FOR 1 SEMESTER OF STUDY ONLY **"VISITORS WITHOUT PERMISSION TO PERFORM PAID ACTIVITIES**"

To participate in an academic program at UDLAP with a duration of up to 180 days (1 semester or 2 trimesters), students are entitled to travel to our country as a **Visitor** (previously known as *Tourist*) if they are citizens of a country that has no visa restrictions in Mexico. This condition of stay authorizes students to remain in Mexican territory uninterruptedly for up to 180 days from the date of entry, without permission to engage in remunerated activities. Foreigners who come to Mexico as Visitors without permission to perform remunerated activities cannot change their migratory status and will have to leave the country by the end of the authorized period of stay.

EXCEPTION: If the student is a citizen of a country with visa restrictions in Mexico, he/she will need to request a Temporary Resident Visa-Student at the nearest Embassy or Consulate of Mexico, as he/she will not be able to enter the country as a visitor.

FOR 2 OR MORE SEMESTERS OF STUDY "TEMPORARY RESIDENT VISA - STUDENT"

To participate in an academic program at UDLAP for a period that is longer than 180 days (2 semesters or more), it is necessary to request a Temporary Resident Visa - Student. Students in this case will need to complete a 3-step process:

- 1. Request for a visa at the nearest Mexican Embassy or Consulate. The visa will be originally issued for 180 days, valid for a single entry to Mexico during this period.
- 2. When students enter Mexico, they will be provided a "Forma Migratoria Múltiple (FMM)". They will need to present this FMM to the "Instituto Nacional de Migración (INAMI)" once they are in Mexico to get the Temporary Residence Permit.
- 3. This **Temporary Residence Permit** must be requested from the INAMI within the first 30 calendar days from the date of entry into Mexico. This card will be valid for one year and allows multiple entries to the country. If this procedure is not completed within the designated time, the student will be subject to pay a fine to the INAMI

UDLAP will provide migratory support for all international students, especially for those coming from a visa-restricted country or for those students coming for two or more semesters, but it is the student's own responsibility to fulfill the INAMI's requirements and to abide by the Mexican Government

Students coming from visa-restricted countries must request such permit before traveling to Mexico. The UDLAP International Office will send an Acceptance Letter to the Home University or to the Mexican Embassy/Consulate in such country in order for students to process a student visa, if necessary

INTERNATIONAL MEDICAL INSURANCE INFORMATION

Medical Insurance is Mandatory to come to UDLAP. Without exception, all International students are required to have health insurance coverage at their own expense that meets all the international coverage requirements (it must include COVID-19, full repatriation of remains and sanitary or emergency evacuation, as a minimum) necessary to cover them during the entire duration of their stay in Mexico. The students must upload a copy of their medical insurance policy to the UDLAP incoming platform as a requirement to complete their registration process. This policy has to contain the following information:

- 1. Student's name
- 2. Insurance company name
- 3. Insurance policy number
- 4. Insurance company's emergency telephone
- 5. Insurance coverage dates
- 6. Main coverage details (repatriation of remain + emergency or sanitary evacuation must be clearly identifiable + COVID-19)

UDLAP provides all international students with free Medical Services (basic care) on campus. Students can access these services by appointment or by arriving at the Health Services Clinic (CL 104) during office hours. Further information may be consulted at

COSTS AND FEES

All courses at UDLAP (Undergraduate and Graduate level) are 6 UDLAP Units (equivalent to 6 ECTS). The cost for each academic unit for 2023 are:

- \$3,410.00 Mexican Pesos for Undergraduate level courses; and
- \$4,210.00* Mexican pesos for graduate-level courses.

As part of a bilateral agreement, **exchange students** are entitled to enroll up to five courses per semester, at the undergraduate level. In the case of Master level courses it is two per trimester (unless otherwise agreed with specific institutions). Additional courses may be taken by covering the corresponding costs attached to the extra courses enrolled.

Visiting students should cover the total cost of the courses enrolled, plus a 2-unit administrative fee. The minimum number of courses to enroll under this scheme is three per semester, unless otherwise agreed.

All other services are included for international students so no additional fees need to be considered (i.e. gym, library, medical services, Wi-Fi, etc.). Costs related to extra-curricular activities are additional and need to be covered by the participating students.

ESTIMATION OF LIVING EXPENSES

Living in Mexico, and in particular in Puebla is quite affordable. Accommodation options are very ample on campus and off campus, as close as crossing the street. The average cost of living for an international student will depend on their particular lifestyle, but some estimations can be exemplified as follows:

On-Campus Housing \$27,110.00 to \$40,610.00 Mexican Pesos per semester, depending on room selection and additional amenities. No meals

included.*

Please note that when housing is not included in the bilateral agreement, the students who choose on-campus

accommodation must pay the full cost of the selected dormitory prior to their arrival at UDLAP.

On-Campus housing for graduate students is not available unless they enroll 400-level courses only (considered Undergraduate

level courses at UDLAP).

There is a strict age restriction for students applying to Residential Colleges: they must be over 18 and under 24 years of age.

Off-Campus Housing Similar costs, depending on the type of accommodation.

\$7,000.000 to \$9,000.00 Mexican Pesos per month.

Local Transportation \$10.00 Mexican Pesos on public bus, \$12.00 Mexican Pesos on UDLAP bus

Taxi, Uber, or DiDi is available at very affordable rates.

Academic expenses \$2,000.00 to \$3,000.00 Mexican Pesos per semester.

Textbooks may cost between \$500.00 and \$1,000.00 Mexican Pesos depending on the discipline.

Personal expenses Movie theater tickets cost between \$50.00 and \$150.00 Mexican Pesos.

A night out at a club may cost up to \$350.00 Mexican Pesos

Bank Information Students are advised to bring an international credit or debit card. There are several ATMs located on campus and throughout

the city.

It is not possible to open a bank account in Mexico while on exchange so it is recommended that students handle their

finances through their home bank.

Cell Phone All International students are required to have a **Mexican phone number** during their stay in Mexico.

A SIM card may be easily acquired at many shops and convenience stores throughout the country.





Online Application

After receiving nominations from the partner universities, the UM International Office will send the students the instructions to apply entirely online. Students will be able to upload the required documents and their stay preferences.

Meeting the admission requirements set out by the University does not guarantee admission of prospective exchange students. Therefore, we recommend applicants not to buy flight tickets before receiving the acceptance letter.

The grading scale goes from 1-12; 6 and above is a passing grade.

UM Academic Assessment

One (1) UM credit is equivalent to 10 class hours.

In order to pass and receive credit for a course, students should:

- 1. Have a minimum class attendance of 75%.
- 2. Obtain a minimum grade of six (6) for the course, which includes midterm papers, oral presentations, and class participation.
- 3. Pass the final examination with at least six (6).

"As UM students, international students can take final exams in 3 examination periods on site. They have to pass the exam before returning to their countries within the examination period. Students must check the exam dates before buying flight tickets.





Course Information

International students must take at least 18 UM credits during the semester.

At the UM, regular students generally take thirty (30) to thirty-five (35) credits per semester.

International students usually take eighteen (18) to twentyfive (25) UM credits per semester.



Language of instruction

At UM, courses are mainly taught in Spanish. Some Schools offer courses seminars, and programs in English, mainly in the semester August-December.



Language requirements

A B2 or C1 level from the Common European Framework of References for Languages (CEFR) is required to attend courses in Spanish. A C1/C2 level is required to take courses in the Translation and Interpretation Degree as well as Portuguese language courses.

Non-Spanish speaking students must take a placement Spanish test upon arrival. The UM has an agreement with International House in Montevideo which offers a discount for students from partner universities who want to take Spanish courses. These courses can lead to a number of UM credits but are not included in the exchange agreement and are on a fee-paying basis.

Students coming to Uruguay should know basic Spanish in order to interact comfortably on a day to day basis.

Students must apply for a student visa (X1 visa for 1-year study, and X2 for 1-semester study) with the JW202 Form and Admission Letter at the Chinese Embassy/Consulate General. For 1-year students, STU International Office will help them get a resident permit after they arrive at STU. These students are required to have a physical examination in Shantou.

Health Insurance/Health Services on campus

Health Insurance is required for international students studying in China. We recommend the insurance policy available at https://www.lxbx.net/home. There's a clinic on campus which is open from Monday to Friday. A doctor will be on duty for emergencies on Saturday, Sunday and after hours.

The airport connects to over 30 cities at home and abroad, such as Hong Kong, Beijing, Shanghai, Guangzhou, Bangkok and Singapore. You may also take a high speed train from other cities in China, such as Shenzhen and Xiamen, to Chaoshan or Shantou Station, which is about 50 minutes from STU by car. Pick up service will be arranged for exchange/visiting students by STU.

MANDATORY HEALTH / MEDICAL INSURANCE

1. Student Accident Insurance and TKU Exchange Student Medical Insurance

- (1) New Student must purchase Student Accident Insurance (185 NTD /semester).
- (2) Student who has not purchased overseas medical insurance in their home country will be required to buy TKU Exchange Student Medical Insurance (2,500 NTD/ 5 months).

2. National Health Insurance (NHI)

National Health Insurance is mandatory for students who stay for one academic year (two

semesters) and have Alien Resident Certificate (ARC). The international students who have stayed in Taiwan for six consecutive months, or exited Taiwan once for less than 30 days, must apply for NHI through the district office by themselves. The fee is \$826 NTD/month.

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





Please note that all students are subject to course availability and/or capacity limitation constraints and in some cases pre-requisites. Exchange students, therefore, are strongly advised to have a flexible course plan. When registering, please take notice of the timeslots to avoid course overlap.

While the standard workload per semester for Reichman students is 6-9 courses, students are strongly advised to consult their home institution and receive approval for their intended courses of study.

Please note that only MA Government courses are available to Master level students and Bachelor (undergraduate) students cannot register for Master level courses.

Course Restrictions

Registration for courses in the following fields are **prohibited**:

- Public Diplomacy, Entrepreneurship, Zell and Argov Fellowship courses.
- MA courses other than approved MA Government courses.
- Computer Science and Law Approval to join Computer Science or Law School courses is subject to final
 approval by the School of Computer Science/Law School and is only an option for students coming from a
 university where we have an exclusive Computer Science or Law exchange agreement as these courses are
 very limited.

Language Courses: Language courses at RU are full year in length and therefore can only be taken by full year exchange students.

Exchange students will receive a dedicated list of BA courses approved for exchange students from a variety of disciplines towards September for Fall 2023 students and towards February for Spring 2023 students.

Grading, Course Credits & Transcript



Reichman University (IDC Herzliya) functions on a 0-100 grading system, where 60 is the minimum passing grade. Some courses work on a pass/fail basis.

Each course is worth between 2-4 credits. A 2 credit course meets for 90 minutes per week over the course of the semester (14 weeks).

Once all final grades are updated, exchange students are able to order their final transcript through their Student Information Platform. Directions to order the official transcript can be found in the "Course Registration Instructions Booklet". Link to this booklet can be found here.

Exams

Each semester is followed by two individual exam periods referred to as Moed 'A' and 'B', which run for approximately four weeks each. Students are automatically scheduled to take exams on the date of the Moed 'A'.

However, where the student is not able to attend the exam on the scheduled date or where the student is unsatisfied with his/her initial result, then the student is able to re-sit a second version of the exam on the date of the Moed 'B'. Students who failed the Moed 'A' are automatically rescheduled to retake the exam on the Moed 'B' date.

Exams Abroad



In exceptional circumstances, exchange students can take their final exams abroad.

A request for an Exam Procedures form must be sent to the student exchange office, filled out by the student and returned up to one (1) month prior to departure.

If approved by the <u>home institution</u>, arrangements will be made to take the final exams at the student's home institution (with a proctor – at the discretion of the home institution).

Housing



Reichman University cannot guarantee student housing on campus for exchange students. Please note – rooms in the dormitories for exchange students are extremely limited with only 10 rooms available for <u>full-year</u> <u>exchange students</u>. Therefore placement is subject to availability on a first-come, first-serve basis.
