

# UNC Greensboro Fact Sheet | Incoming Exchange Program

<u>UNC Greensboro</u>, located in the <u>Piedmont Triad region</u> of North Carolina, is 1 of only 40 doctoral institutions recognized by the Carnegie Foundation for both <u>high research activity</u> and <u>community engagement</u>. #### The online application includes:

- Official Transcript
- Proof of English Proficiency (if applicable)
- Questionnaires
- Signature Documents
- 2 Letters of Recommendation (if applying for post graduate exchange)

GPA: Minimum 2.75/4.0 English Language Proficiency: TOEFL: 79 ibt IELTS: 6.0 (6.5 for post graduate) Duolingo English Test DET 110

### **Application Period**

#### Spring/Calendar Year

- Application opens: July 1
- Nominations due: Sept 23
  - Deadline: October 7

#### Fall/Academic Year

- Application opens: December 3
- Nominations due: March 11
  - Deadline: April 1

### Housing

### **Immunizations & Health Insurance**

#### Immunizations

Students will be responsible for providing proof of immunizations upon their arrival to campus, no later than 30 days from the start of classes. Visit <u>https://shs.uncg.edu/immunizations</u> for information on required immunizations. Step-by-step instructions on how to complete the medical history and immunization form will be available to exchange students post-acceptance.

### **Health Insurance**

All students are required to have health insurance coverage. International students can enroll in the university insurance program, Student Blue. Exchange students can waive the Student Blue insurance and substitue it for a preferred insurance policy. Preferred policies must meet the following requirements:

- Minimum total benefit/coverage of \$100,000 (USD) per accident or illness
- Plan deductible of no more than \$500 (USD)
- Minimum of \$50,000 (USD) for medical evacuation
- Minimum of \$25,000 (USD) for repatriation
- Policy must be active for the entire duration of the academic semester

Students cannot start the process of waiving out of the mandatory insurance until after acceptance to the exchange program. More details about the specific waiver process will be provided postacceptance.
